The minimum scholarship amount is \$1,000. Applicants must be a senior graduating from a Beaverton School District High School in 2022 and culturally identify as Black/African-American/African/Afro-Latino, or other cultural identities from the African Diaspora.

Scholarship awards will be announced at the Beaverton Black Graduation on Sunday, May 21, 2022. Recipients will also be featured on the Beaverton Black Parent Union Website. Scholarship awards will be sent to the educational institution identified in the application (including trade schools, 2 year and 4-year programs, and service education). If an educational institution has not yet been identified, funds will be held for one year.
